I also wanted to share some advice that has been circulated among independent school leaders regarding school closings. *The main purpose of school closings is to keep people apart so they do not spread the COVID-19 virus. What we've learned so far from the COVID-19 virus is that it's highly transmissible, even from people who don't exhibit symptoms. As such, it is recommended that during school closures you don't plan playdates or have group trips to the mall or other public places. These outings defeat the purpose of closing schools.*

**As of this writing, the school will be closed to parents, students and visitors.** For the most part, faculty, staff and administrators will not be on campus during the school closure, but all of us are available via email. We are continuing to monitor the overall COVID-19 situation and will provide information regarding the weeks beyond Spring Break at a later date.
